### **TEACHER'S TRAINING WORKSHOPS/SEMINAR 2020-21** Online trainings and Webinars

Online Workshop on "Competency based assessment" attended by Mr.Sagar Mistri (TGT Science) on 20<sup>th</sup> July and 21<sup>st</sup> July 2022. Workshop has been conducted by NABET (National Accreditation Board for Education & Training) which is a constituent Board of Quality

Council of India (QCI). This exclusive workshop has been conducted by three renowned resource persons-

1. Dr. Gaurang Tiwari 2. Dr. Bhaskar C. 3. Mr. Arun Pandey

On the first day of workshop, after giving brief introduction about NABET, QCI and FEED (Formal Education Excellence Division) understanding of CBSE initiatives were discussed for Competency based Assessment framework for Science for Classes 6<sup>th</sup> to 10<sup>th</sup> in which the main focus was on theoretical understanding of Assessment Objectives of Science.

On the second day, hands on activities for creating CBA test items in science were conducted.

#### TRAINING ON CYBER SAFETY AND SECURITY: -

An online training on Cyber Safety and Security was organized by CIET-NCERT on 12<sup>th</sup> and 13<sup>th</sup> December 2022. It was attended by Mr. Jayesh Yadav (TGT-Computer). # ORIENTATION PROGRAMME FOR TEACHERS IN EDUCATION IN HUMAN VALUES BY DR PITRE: -

Two days teacher's training session was conducted on 15<sup>th</sup> June and 16<sup>th</sup> June, 2022. On 15<sup>th</sup> June, the day started with chanting of Omkaram. The first session was on the topic-"Education in Human Values". The resource person was Dr. B.G Pitre. The key highlights of his session are as follows-

-4 C's, Parenting Program and Experiential learning Approach.

-Role of teacher.

Second session was taken by Principal on the topic-**Five Domains of Personality** in which he explained about the Physical, Intellect, Emotional, Psychic and Spiritual Domains.

After lunch break, in the next session by Dr. Pitre was on the topic- Walls of Dharma.

He explained that essence of all 5 personality domains is to balance the five values given by Baba. We must give back what we receive. The harmony of Head, Hands and Heart reflects true human life.

The second day (16/6/22) started with Omkaram and Bhajans. Thereafter first session on "Sai Teacher" was taken by Mr. Sagar Mistri (TGT-Science). The key highlights of his session are:

- Prime goal of Sri Satya Sai Educational institution is to impart "Man Making Education" and human excellence.
- ✤ Academic excellence comes next to Human excellence.
- According to Baba; "Worldly education makes man great, whereas spiritual education makes him good".

After lunch break a session on "experiential Learning" was taken by Mrs. Pratima Srivastava (PRT) and Mrs. Neelima Kujur (PRT). They explained the steps and techniques to be followed while conducting Experiential learning in classroom.

The day ended with Shanti path.

#### **ORIENTATION SESSION FOR TEACHERS ON SCHOOL ETHOS: -**

An orientation session was taken by Principal on 17<sup>th</sup> June, 2022. He briefed the teachers about school policies, leave rules, medical, dress code, how to respond to CBSE circulars and many more things. Self-Appraisal form was also filled by all the teachers.

#### SESSION ON NEP (NATIONAL EDUCATION POLICY)-2020 AND 21<sup>ST</sup> CENTURY SKILLS: -

An interactive session on NEP and 21<sup>st</sup> century skills was organized on 18<sup>th</sup> June, 2022. The resource person was Mr. Anurag Gupta (Principal-Vidya Niketan School, Gwalior). The session started with Omkaram. Mr. Gupta emphasized that a strong bridge should be created between teacher and student for more clarity of concepts, good level of grasping, strong subjective concept and inculcation of life skills. He discussed about ideal classroom categorization based and time distribution. He also told the merits and demerits of NEP. The program ended with Shanti Path.

Mr. Chetan Paliwal attended two days' workshop on "Office procedure and Practices" conducted by CBSE. The venue was National Victor public school, New Delhi. The resource persons were -Mrs. Monika Yadav and Mrs. Priyanka Mehta.

They emphasized on the introduction of "No Stream policy" as mentioned in New Education Policy in all schools. According to this policy, there should not be barrier of any stream now and students shall take subject of their choice from any stream.

#### **SESSION ON BRAIN GYM: -**

An exclusively designed Teacher's training session was conducted by school's Special Educator Ms.Geetika Solanki on 10<sup>th</sup> Oct 2022 in Computer Lab. This session was conducted for all the primary teachers of Classes-ECCE to Class 5<sup>th</sup>. The topic of the session was "Learning by Movement-Brain Gym". Dr. E. Paul Dennison first coined the term-Brain Gym as he believes that "Movement is the door to Learning" and brain gym exercises are designed to help the brain functions better for effective Learning process of students. An idea behind this teacher's session was to aware them about scientific benefits of Brain gym which helps good blood flow to the brain for excellent learning and grasping.

Major highlights of the session on brain gym were- to adopt and practiced it within daily classroom practices with Primary students, to improve Attention span, Concentration, memory, LSRWC (Listening, speaking, reading, writing & Comprehension Skills).

Few essential movements were demonstrated and practiced with teachers - Cross crawl, midline crossing, double-doodle, sleeping-8, Thinking Caps, Rolling & tapping by finger push, Brain buttons, Hook-Ups and elephant pose, etc.

As over-all conclusion Brain gym exercises increases PACE of current learning level of students. All the teachers actively participated in the session and exercised all the movements so well.

#### SESSION ON "PROMOTING WILLINGNESS TO WRITE IN PRESCHOOLERS": -

Promoting willingness to write is one of the most important aspects of Pre-school students. It has to be taken care of during early school years only. Teacher's training session for teachers of Pre - primary (ECCE) and Primary was conducted by school's Special Educator Mrs. Geetika Solanki within 2 Parts on: 12<sup>th</sup> October 2022 and 14<sup>th</sup> October 2022. The topic of the training was "Promoting willingness to write in preschoolers" to update teachers about various scientific fine motor skills strengthening exercises. The session began with an introduction of "Checklist to identify age-appropriate fine motor and gross motor milestones achieved by pre -primary students" (Aged-3 to 8 Years) and to identify their Prewriting skills. Several fine motor skills strengthening exercises and Handwriting warm-up exercises were demonstrated with the help of home –based tools and expert tips. Major highlights of the entire session were: How to identify best ideal pencil grasp, hand yoga and finger yoga exercises, concept and benefits of using of Golf pencil and short broken crayons, best ideal type of pencil type as "Triangular". Usage Grip correction device in case of weak finger muscles, Brain balancing exercises for maintaining good flow of handwriting were also demonstrated and well-practiced by enthusiastic teacher learners. All the teachers actively participated and learnt about scientific tools, techniques, exercises and effective strategy to deal with "Writing issues".

#### LEADERSHIP TALK (MINISTRY OF EDUCATION'S INNOVATION CELL): -

The first leadership talk for schools was conducted in Sri Sathya Sai Vidya Vihar, GAIL, Vijaipur by Ministry of Education's Innovation Cell on 18th November, 2022 at 11 am by means of a YouTube link shared in advance by SIC team of CBSE. All the Innovation council members of the school along with students of classes 9th and 10th participated in it. There were 58 male student participants and 44 female student participants along with 14 teachers. Under this talk, an interview with Mr. Yashraj Bharadwaj - a notable successful 23-year-old entrepreneur was conducted. He is the cofounder of Petonic Infotech Fellow and Advisor, UC Berkeley. He encouraged students to have a mindset of becoming Entrepreneurs 24x7 in your school life and about doing and working upon whatever excites you and drives you the most. It depends upon what your hunger is. He told that how he and his twin brother googled the name of those professors, researchers and authors who were working on those related topics and over several months tried to build and discuss these concepts with them. He said that if one really wishes to find, many good people are always there to help. He also emphasized that how social media has taken over the lives of young children and how it will not help them to focus on the correct things. He also emphasized the fact that one should always keep talking about your decisions with your parents and mentors as they might say something in the discussion that would impact a lot on the

decision making. This generation has to understand the importance of digital presence to the start-up and is crucial especially in India with a market of 130 billion people. It makes effective due to the digital outreach to the public. The advantages of becoming an entrepreneur besides being your own boss is to learn and take decisions, take risks and if you succeed you win and have a smile or satisfaction on your face. If you do not succeed, you learn and take care in the next decision one makes. This feeling to be able to achieve that satisfaction and never to chase after money is what an entrepreneur should look forward for. This talk was truly inspirational and students gained a lot from this session.

#### CBSE WORKSHOP ON "STRENGTHENING ASSESSMENT & EVALUATION PRACTICES": -

Two teachers (Mrs. Anitha Biju and Mr. Sagar Mistri) and the Principal Mr. Manoj Kothekar attended one-day CBSE workshop on 11.11.2022 at Army Public School, Mhow. The topic for the workshop was "Strengthening Assessment & Evaluation Practices". The Resource persons were Mrs. Poonam Shekhawat and Mrs. Rekha Kapoor. Following points were covered during the workshop:

- CBSE Circular ACAD-57/2022 and other related circulars.
- Understanding the purpose of Multiple Assessment, Periodic Tests, Student Portfolio and Subject Enrichment Activities.
- Co-scholastic activities as per the remodeled structure of Assessment.
- Schools to adopt Learning Outcomes.
- 'Assessment OF Learning' must be augmented with 'Assessment AS Learning' & 'Assessment FOR Learning'.
- LOTS (Lower Order Thinking Skill) Questions and HOTS (Higher Order Thinking Skill) Questions
- LAAR Cycle of Assessment
- Documents for Assessment
- Competency Based Learning
- Preparing blue print and question paper (Bloom's Taxonomy Verbs, Typology of Questions, Structure of a Test Blue-print)

At the end of the workshop a test was also conducted to test our understanding. We are following all the norms of CBSE related to "Assessment & Evaluation" and our knowledge got further strengthened.

#### TEAM DEVELOPMENT WORK SHOP (MUMBAI): -

The principal attended a team building workshop conducted by National Council of Sri Sathya Sai schools at Dharmakshetra Mumbai from 24th December to 28th December 2022.

#### WORKSHOP ON STRENGTHENING ASSESSMENT AND EVALUATION: -

A two-day capacity building programme on the topic "Strengthening Assessment and Evaluation Practices" was conducted in school on 30<sup>th</sup> and 31<sup>st</sup> January 2023. Teachers from

11 schools participated and there were 56 participants in all. The participating schools were Sri Sathya Sai Vidya Vihar GAIL Vijaipur (Host School), Delhi Public School (NFL, Vijaipur,) Hindupath Public school (Raghogarh, Aron and Jamner), Vandana Convent School (Guna), Sonali Public School (Guna), Vidhya Bhawan (Guna), Jay Jyoti (JUET), Sanskruti School (Ashoknagar)and Shanti Public School (Guna). It was conducted by CBSE. The resource persons were Mrs. Poonam Shekhawat (Principal-Vedanta Global School, Indore) and Mr. G. K. Udgata (Principal- DAV, Bina Refinary, Bina).

On the first day the session started with Omkaram followed by Medhasuktam and Lighting of lamp. After the introduction of the resource persons, the session began with an introductory activity in which each participant has to tell their name by adding name of their favorite food starting with first letter of their name. thereafter a handout was given to all in which they had to fill about the various barriers they face while implementing their plan in the classroom for covering the syllabus. A circular regarding the changes in the Internal year end/board exam for classes IX and X was discussed. How to make a question paper based on Bloom's taxonomy and accordingly how to make a blue print was explained. In the Post lunch session, discussion was done on Portfolio. Mrs. Poonam Shekhawat told that it is essential to maintain a portfolio of each student. It can be used over an academic session, a term or a shorter period depending on the purpose. Discussion on subject enrichment activities was also done. All the participants were divided into groups and tasks were assigned for them for next day of workshop.

The day 2 started with Omkaram and a value song. Each group gave a short presentation on the topic assigned to them. The different topics were Subject enrichment activities, making Blue print, bringing change in the question paper etc. Thereafter, Mr. Udgata very well explained about how the grades are calculated which are seen in the report cards of board classes. Various circulars regarding two levels of mathematics question papers were also explained by him. In the Post lunch session, Mrs. Poonam Shekhawat explained about the importance of sixth additional subject introduced by CBSE, about art Integrated learning, Health and Physical Education and Discipline. In between the session, Assessment sheets were given to all participants. At the end of the workshop, all the participants were given the certificates. The two days were full of interaction and lots of learning.

#### **AIOT INTEGRATION IN CURRICULUM: -**

Master trainer training on AI and Tinkering Integration in Curriculum was organized by CBSE under the auspices of NITI Aayog, trained by INTEL at Kolkata on 27<sup>th</sup> and 28<sup>th</sup> March 2023. Four teachers namely Archana Bhadoria (PGT-BIO), Devesh Sarswat (PRT), Prankit Namdeo (PGT-Computer Science) and Sachin Prajapati (TGT-Social science) attended the training. The Resource persons were Mr. Anoop Singh Rawat and Mrs. Sapna Bisht, Mrs. Shilpa Sethi and Ms. Yukti Chandra from CBSE and INTEL.

On first day of the training Dr. Biswajit Saha, Director (Trainings & Skill Education), CBSE addressed the trainees from 13 schools and emphasized on the framing of application and competency-based questions and integrating AI and tinkering in all subjects and on the second day tried hands on arduino UNO coding using PICTOBLOX.

The training was a great learning, and helped in understanding the lesson plan format and the Program Implementation plan.

#### **CBSE ONLINE TRAINING: -**

A five-day online training programme was conducted by CBSE on the topic- "Digital Infrastructure for Knowledge Sharing – DIKSHA" from March 27 to 31, 4 PM to 5 PM every programme day. Principal and Santosh Kumar Raul participated this programme.
